Moelyci Environmental Centre – climate change project

Thanks to the Meteorological Office and Environment Wales we have a weather station at Moelyci which enables us to take daily weather records and equipment to study habitat microclimates. We will be using the data we collect to monitor climate changes over the next few years. In conjunction with the weather monitoring project we are starting another project to record wildlife sightings e.g. when migratory birds arrive, when plants flower and when moths fly. We can then relate the wildlife data to the weather/ microclimate data to learn more about the effect that climate change has on our wildlife. We will use the results in our conservation courses and for some of our group visits.
